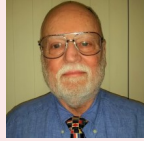

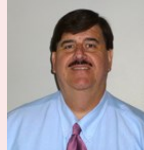

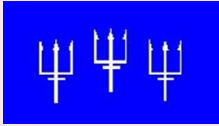

I'd like to share a couple of things you may also enjoy.

Good online course website

The Sea Scouts shared a educational website with me that delivers interesting and useful free sail training. It's [NauticEd.com](https://www.nauticed.com/) by a New Zealander and if you are a good sailor, this will make you a better sailor. If you are an old salt, this just might make you unbearable because no matter how experienced you are there are some nuggets to gain from the online experience. Start with the free-bees and decide if continuing is worth it to you. I completed Small Boat Skipper, Skipper (30+ sloop), Rules of the Road and Sail Trim. I find it worth it since it complements our programs rather than competing with U.S. Power Squadrons training. It's free!

New sailing movie: Greyhound

Look out for this new movie starring Tom Hanks, called *Greyhound*, based on a 1955 C.S. Forester novel, *The Good Shepard*. It features a US Navy Commander assigned to defend a merchant ship convoy under attack in 1942 Battle of the Atlantic in World War II

It has the same attention to detail as his novels of the character in the Royal Navy, Horatio Hornblower, during the Napoleonic War era. The original title captures the Protestant metaphor that runs throughout the film, specifically the leadership, devotion, commitment and sacrifice if necessary for the good of the convoy. A movie of the same name about the CIA came out a decade ago, so this film is *Greyhound*, the ship's call sign. This film was scheduled to be released June 12, but is delayed due to the pandemic.

Fishing License Information

Every person who is required to have a license to fish, hunt, and/or trap must carry such license with them (electronic copy, printed paper, or annual hard card) and show the license immediately upon request of any officer whose duty it is to enforce the game and inland fish laws, or upon the demand of any owner or lessee, or any employee or representative of such owner or lessee, upon whose land or water such person may be hunting, trapping, or fishing.

Residency Qualifications

1. Persons who have been a bonafide resident of the city, county, or state for six consecutive months immediately preceding the date of application for license;
2. Persons who have been domiciliary residents of the state for at least two months upon approval of a completed affidavit to be furnished by the Game Department;
3. Legal voters in Virginia;
4. Any member of the armed forces of the United States, or a member of the immediate family of such a member as defined in § 2.2-3101, upon execution of a certificate of residence if the member (i) resides in the Commonwealth, (ii) is on active duty, and (iii) is stationed at a military installation within, or in a ship based in, the Commonwealth;
5. Students (including nonresident students boarding on campus) residing in Virginia who are enrolled in bonafide Virginia schools;
6. Any unnaturalized person who owns real estate in the county or city and who has actually resided there not less than five years next preceding the date of the application for the license in the county or city where they qualify.

Exceptions

All persons, except those listed in this section, at <https://www.dgif.virginia.gov/fishing/regulations/licenses/>, must purchase the proper licenses before fishing.

License Fees

The issuance fee is included in the prices at <https://www.dgif.virginia.gov/fishing/regulations/licenses/>

- Resident and nonresident licenses are valid for one year from the date of purchase unless otherwise noted.
- * A valid trout license (annual or lifetime) is required in addition to other resident licenses only if you are fishing in designated stocked trout waters (October 1–June 15).

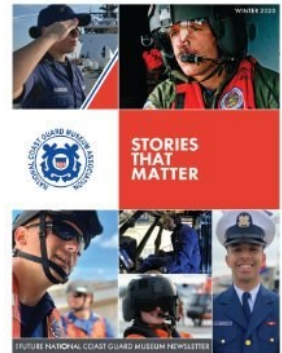

New name for DGIF: Dept. of Wildlife Resources



Effective July 1, 2020, the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) will change its name to the Virginia Department of Wildlife Resources.

The name is being changed because the demographics of Virginia and mission of DGIF have changed. The name DGIF has lost its relevance to the general public and non-sportsmen. Today many are not familiar with the terminology of "game" animals. Also, the department's mission and wildlife management responsibilities now extend far beyond game species.

The new name, Department of Wildlife Resources, should be more readily recognizable to all citizens. It should assist the department, which is self-funded by license sales, in attracting new customers and funding sources.

Message from the Educational Officer

Even as we are constrained from meeting as a group, national educational staff at the Power Squadron has encouraged and authorized hybrid and online courses. Virginia is one of the few states that do not recognize the online America's Boating Course because they insist on a proctored exam. In the spirit of getting members trained in new skills to be safe and competent on the water, I'd like to offer a **Piloting course online via Zoom** on Saturday AM (1030-1300) starting at the end of June. Tentative dates look like 27 June -- but not 4 July – 11, 18, 25 July and 8, 15 August. The exam is take-home and you will have a week to complete it. The exam is not hard, but sloppy work and easy mistakes cost points that add up. I have some great test pointer prep from Jay Nelson who ensured everyone aced the past exam.

Piloting includes Inland water and coastal navigation using GPS, aids to navigation, and plotting on charts. No prerequisites. More course info at:
